

GDPR

General Data Protection Regulations came into effect from May 25th this year. The Charleville Centre must adhere to these regulations from this date. This will protect the privacy rights of individuals and safeguard their personal data. From now on we need your permission to contact you on a personal basis. If you have any queries please don't hesitate to contact us.

In general, the Centre does not hold any personal data on individuals, but it complies with its obligations under the GDPR by keeping personal data up to date, by storing and destroying it securely, by not collecting or retaining excessive amounts of data, by protecting personal data from loss, misuse, unauthorized access and disclosure and by ensuring that appropriate technical measures are in place to protect personal data.

Personal Data relates to a living individual who can be identified from that data. Identification can be by the information alone or in conjunction with any other information in the data controller's possession or likely to come into such possession. The processing of personal data is governed by the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).

- Access their personal Information
- Have personal data erased
- Have personal data corrected
- Restrict processing
- Object
